The behavior we observed in our society was much like behavior you see today in your world: fighting, stealing, lying, cheating, spreading rumors, and more clandestine things like lusting after another man's wife.

We needed a list, a simple and short one. If everyone could just buy into this list and follow each item, this would help us in two ways. First of all, we would have a more peaceful and orderly society. And second, this would help more of us to get past the pearly gates and get to heaven, the promised land, after living a hard life here (for as long as a person's life here lasted).
